Board of Dispensing Opticians: Informational Report – Executive Order 2023-003

Pursuant to Executive Order 2023-003, a report must be submitted with the following information:

Section 1 - Comprehensive Review of Regulations

Every executive branch department, agency, board and commission shall undertake a comprehensive review of the regulations subject to its enforcement. On or before, May 1, 2023 each department, agency, board and commission shall provide a report to the Governor's office detailing how the regulation subject to its enforcement can be streamlined, clarified, reduced or otherwise improved to ensure those regulations provide for the general welfare of the State without unnecessarily inhibiting economic growth.

The report must include for **each** regulation identified in the comprehensive review that can be streamlined, clarified, reduced, or otherwise improved to ensure that the regulation provide for the general welfare of the State without unnecessarily inhibiting economic growth:

- The citation of the regulation with clear indication of the proposed modification in blue italics and matters to be omitted in red and bracketed.

- A clear and concise explanation on why such change should occur.

He suggested the Board include a regulation clarifying that an optician must inspect ophthalmic lenses with a lensometer to verify they comply with ANSI standards prior to dispensing them. He objected to the removal of a requirement for an applicant to be lawfully entitled to remain and work in the United States.
 - iii. Corey Roveri submitted written comments on behalf of the Opticians Association of Nevada (OAN). The OAN expressed support for most of the revisions proposed by the Board, but objected to the removal of a requirement for an applicant to be lawfully entitled to remain and work in the United States. The comments also included recommendations for license reciprocity and concerns regarding the definitions of "inspection" and "verification".
 - iv. David Wolosin spoke at the meeting. He asked the Board to reconsider the requirement that an optician have a radioscope available to perform contact lens fittings, as he does not believe that type of equipment is still being manufactured.
